



1. Rules of hygiene and behavior BAG / BASPO / Swiss Olympic

2. Prevention

- Health is a top priority; high level of solidarity and personal responsibility are required.
- People with Covid-19 symptoms must stay away from the event.
- Each athlete, supervisor and helper confirms with a signature on arrival that they are healthy and have no Covid 19 symptoms.
- If a Covid-19 case is diagnosed afterwards (max. 14 days), the OK and Swiss-Ski must be informed as soon as possible. The OK reports the case to the responsible authorities.

3. Information material

- Posters and rules of conduct from Swiss Olympic, the BASPO and the BAG are put up.

4. Arrival and departure

- Individually within the team by private car / bus.
- When arriving on the team bus, wearing a mask is compulsory (distance rule).
- When traveling by public transport, the BAG rules must be observed.

5. Accreditation / team captain information

- Only FIS licensed athletes are allowed to race.
- The team captain reports to the race office at the specified time. The team captain brings the list with the names and telephone numbers of all people present (athletes, coaches, service, etc.) with their signature, which confirms that everyone arrives symptom-free. The list is the basis for contact tracing.
All athletes and supervisors must have a negative test that is not older than 72 hours.



- At the Team Captain Meeting (TCM), wearing a face mask is compulsory.
- The OC appoints a Covid-19 contact person who informs the team captains about the protection concept. (Stefan Matter)
- Each team is responsible for the flow of information within their team and for compliance with the protective regulations.
- Visitors are not allowed to enter the competition area. The start and finish area will be cordoned off.

6. Registration OC

- All those involved (OC, officials, helpers, media) must register via the OC. The registration list must be kept for up to 14 days after the event.
- Participants (OK, officials, helpers, media) are tested by us with a quick test before the first entry.

7. Conduct on the competition area

- Registered team members are allowed access to the competition course in compliance with the applicable rules of conduct and protective measures.
- In the start area, on the route inspection, in the finish area and at the announcement of the rankings, the rules of distance must be observed and a face mask is compulsory.
- All those involved (OC, officials, helpers, media) are requested not to mix with athletes / supervisors for the entire duration of the competition.
- There will be separate entrances in the access area to the chairlift; A: for athletes, supervisors, employees and track staff, B: other visitors
- Sufficient space for the teams will be cordoned off in the start area so that a mix of the athletes is prevented as much as possible.
A separate access will be created for the employees.
- All athletes must visibly wear their start number on the competition area.
- All helpers will wear a marked vest.

8. Helpers

- The employees are fed on the race days with lunch in a separate heated room.
- Masks are compulsory for all helpers.
- All helpers are tested with a quick test before they work there first shift.



9. Starting numbers

- The start numbers are deposited on a start number stand and must be picked up and returned in person.

10. Award ceremony

- Face masks are compulsory at the award ceremony.
- The winners take the prizes themselves.

11. Communication

- All registered teams will be answered by the OC to the respective registration address and the program and the protection concept will be sent.

12. Protective material

- All participants and visitors are responsible for their own protection material (face masks, disinfectant) and bring this with personally.

13. Contact Tracing

- The list of team captains' contact details must be kept for up to 14 days after the event and it must be possible to identify them at the request of the cantonal health authorities.
- Swiss-Ski recommends downloading and activating the "SwissCovid App".

14. Amount of people need

- Athlets: 80
- Supervisors: 20
- Helpers: 50
